I also met Ivy Hover of Left Coast Cellars in Rickreall and tried the 2008 Left Bank Pinot Blanc.

If guests arrived a little hungry, they could enjoy amazing appetizers from Creative Catering, Crooked House Bistro, Morton's and Jonathan's.

Throughout the reception, you could hear the booming voice of auctioneer Steve Talbot warning us that tables would soon close. Jim and Chane Griggs were watching a few tables, as were Jason and Dena Beyrouty.

Family Building Blocks Executive Director Sue Miller introduced me to a few of the many event sponsors, including Steve Altman of Merrill Lynch and Deana and Tyler Freres of Freres Lumber.

Soon the group moved downstairs to dine inside a large heated tent. Plasma screens displayed sponsor names and the live auction items that would be offered to the highest bidder.
